### Le Fleuve SENEGAL et l'Intégration de l'Afrique de l'Ouest en 2011



Les Etats africains sont confrontés à une crise économique et sociale profonde que les politiques d'ajustement structurel n'ont pas pu résorber. Dans un tel contexte, il est indispensable de rechercher des alternatives susceptibles de sortir le continent de l'impasse dans laquelle il se trouve.

L'ambition de cet ouvrage est de participer à un tel débat, en s'inscrivant dans une perspective de promotion et/ou de renforcement de l'intégration économique. C'est ainsi qu'il traite d'abord de l'historique, de la problématique de l'aménagement

et du développement du bassin du fleuve Sénégal dans son environnement physique, économique et humain. Il examine ensuite les stratégies d'aménagement et de développement de l'OMVS pour en dégager les forces, les faiblesses et les limites éventuelles, et faire des propositions susceptibles de les améliorer. Enfin, l'ouvrage définit les mesures à prendre pour améliorer les conditions d'existence des populations riveraines du fleuve Sénégal à l'horizon de l'an 2011, sur la base d'une approche intégrée et participative de développement humain décentralisé. L'auteur plaide en faveur d'une réunification fédérative des Etats riverains et de leur intégration au sein d'un ensemble ouest-africain plus vaste et plus viable.

Cet ouvrage sera d'un apport inestimable à tous ceux qui s'intéressent au développement de l'Afrique.

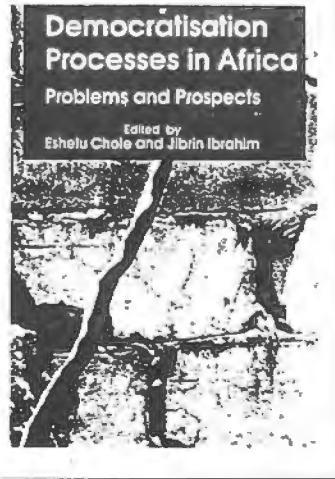

This book is a selection of papers presented at the Seventh General Assembly of CODESRIA (Dakar, 10-14 February 1992). It is a presentation by African scholars of reflections and cross-sectional analyses of the social, political and economic transformations that have shaken Africa since the end of the 1980s.

Some of the authors of this book have been closely associated with CODESRIA's activities and have largely contributed to developing and consolidating its scientific credibility. Unchallenged and outstanding masters of different theoretical domains, they have played a primary role in the promotion of a space for a creative and original reflection. Their common

aspiration is to develop strength, imagination and inspiration which enables them to speak differently of Africa, while using different perspectives and languages. This approach has led them to soberly address the most complex issues relative to the current democratisation process in Africa, using very sound theoretical references. They monitor, identify and name the logic and dynamics of the current changes.

They also dissect the foundations of democratic discourses to determine their structuring. Finally, they call on us to take due cognisance of the severe social and historical constraints, as well as to the African potentialities.

This book is a valuable contribution to our understanding of developments occurring in the African continent as we approach the end of the twentieth century.

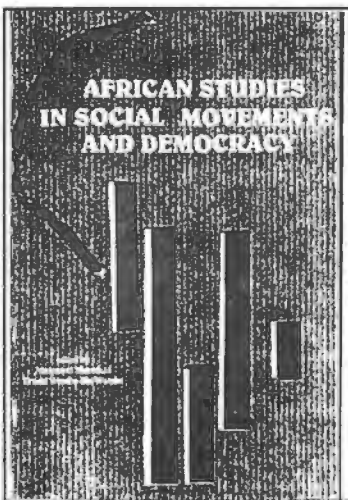

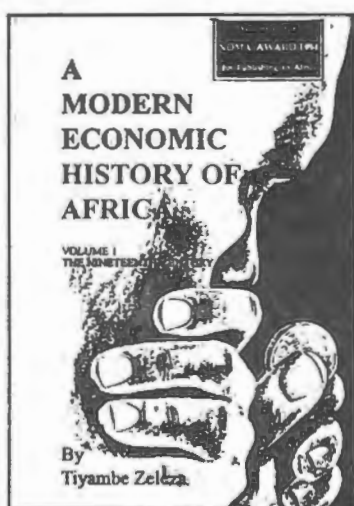

## NEW RELEASE CODESRIA BOOK SERIES



The nineteenth century in Africa was a time of revolution and tumultuous change in virtually all spheres. Violent dry spells, the staggered abolition of the slave trade, mass migrations and an influx of new settlers characterised the century. Regional trade links grew stronger and stretched further. The century also saw the beginnings of the ruthless and bloody quest for foreign domination.

This book, which won the Norma Award for Publishing in Africa in 1994, received the following jury citation: 'the book is an exercise in historical reconstruction, and its strength and distinction lies above all in its bold and

convincing challenge to hitherto accepted orthodoxies, terminologies, and interpretations, about the nature and development of African societies and economies. The jury considered a further achievement of the book to be its 'successful, continent-wide approach' and 'its thorough accessibility'. The very full documentary apparatus in the book, 'which also makes it an extremely useful work of reference', was similarly praised by the jury. The publisher, CODESRIA, was commended for 'having shown great enterprise in identifying and supporting the author and finding him the necessary resources'.
