

NEW RELEASE CODESRIA BOOK SERIES



The nature of Agricultural transformation in Africa is shrouded with too many facile generalizations. During the current conjuncture, the most widely used concepts to describe African agriculture are stagnation and collapse.

Challenging these static and simplistic notions, this book demonstrates the diverse and heteregeneous patterns of agrarian change in Africa. Consisting of 13 case studies, the book presents a typology wich is reflective of the politico-economic diversity of Africa.

Thus, two "etatist" and two "market ori-

ented" regimes represent the "mineral-rent countries", while the other cases focus on countries which rely predominantly on agriculture. Among the latter, a further classification isolates the specific case of the more environmentally fragile economies of the Sahel. Meanwhile, contributors explore local, national and global dimensions that shape the relationship between the State and agriculture.


The result is an excellent comparative overview of the African experience and portrays the varied process of change in the structures and relations of production and social differentiation.

This new book in the CODESRIA BOOK SERIES, is intended to encourage African researchers to reflect on the changing realities of the continent and to present the outcome to a wide public. As such the book should find a place on any reading list that addresses Agriculture in Africa as well as the continent's overall development.

The book is the outcome of a National Working Group in Tanzania under the auspicies of CODESRIA. The focus is on elucidating relations between the State and the working people in post-independence Tanzania. In addition to a powerful introduction by Issa Shivji, the rest of the six chapters tackle the parliament and the electoral process, the party, labour legislation, the State and peasantry,



cooperative societies and marketing boards and student struggles. According to one of the recent reviews

Africa is by no means an easy task. But what makes the present work even more interesting is that it focuses attention on Tanzania. As Issa Shivji puts it, "The Tanzania State is among the few in Africa which has hitherto managed to sustain a liberal image while at the same time establishing a virtual organizational hegemony over its working people and popular classes". How did Tanzania

achieve this enviable record? This is one of the questions which this collection of essays seeks to answer.

On the whole the book makes a very valid contribution to political debates going on in Africa. It would be compulsory reading for anyone wishing to understand the nature of neo-colonial societies, the role of the State in destroying democratic organizations.
