

The focus is on elucidating relations between the State and the working people in post-independence Tanzania. In addition to a powerful introduction by Issa Shivji, the rest of the six chapters tackle the parliament and the electoral process, the party, labour legislation, the State and peasantry,

Cet ouvrage est le premier qui a été produit par un groupe national de travail francophone du CODESRIA. Il se propose, depuis des horizons pluridisciplinaires divers (Histoire, Sociologie politique, Economie...), de jeter des éclairages sur les structures étatiques au Maroc dans la longue durée afin de répondre aux interrogations majeures suivantes : quelles sont les mutations importantes de l'Etat marocain survenues sous l'effet de la pénétration étrangère? Dans quelle mesure ces mutations sont-elles porteuses d'une nouvelle nature de l'Etat marocain? Une modification de la nature de l'Etat est-elle nécessairement corrélatrice d'un changement de sa forme phénoménale d'organisation (type du régime politique)? Quel type de mutations des structures étatiques post-coloniales? Y a-t-il continuité ou discontinuité par rapport à l'administration coloniale?

Il comporte six études réparties en deux grands thèmes qui sont les suivants : les mutations des structures étatiques sous la pression de la pénétration étrangère et la continuité et la rupture dans l'Etat marocain post-colonial. Ces études viennent après une introduction détaillée de Abdelali DOUMOU qui a assuré la direction scientifique de ces travaux.

Dans l'ensemble cet ouvrage constitue non seulement une contribution significative aux études consacrées à l'analyse de la nature et des fonctions de l'Etat en général mais il complète harmonieusement des études faites antérieurement sur "l'Etat dans les Sociétés dépendantes".

Citations in the text should read thus : (Amin, 1975) or, for specific quotations, (Amin, 1975, pp. 61-62). The convention (Amin, 1975 A), (Amin, 1975 B), should be used if more than one publication by the same author (s) in a particular year is cited. References should be listed in full, alphabetically at the end of the paper in the following style :
