«Women in Nigeria» (WIN), is an organization that emerged from the First Annual Women in Nigeria Conference held in 1982. At this conference, Women and Men from all over Nigeria pledged themselves to the task of establishing an organization which would work for an improvement in the conditions of Nigerian women. To this end, «Women in Nigeria» (WIN) organizes a conference every year around different themes to promote the study of women and disseminate this information. In 1983, WIN's theme was «Women and the Family» and this book (published jointly with CODESRIA) is a selection of some of the papers presented at that conference, which was also partly sponsored by CODESRIA.

A careful reading of this book leads to the conclusion that it is a serious analysis of the socio-economic and political conditions in Nigeria. This should not be surprising since WIN maintains that the liberation of women outside the context of the liberation of the oppressed and poor majority of people in Nigeria is bound to be illusory. Thus while the emancipation of women should not be subsumed under the general banner of the struggle for liberation or against oppression, feminist organizations must recognize and deal with class relations and inequalities.

The Council for the Development of Economic and Social Research in Africa (CODESRIA) is a non-governmental pan-African organization based in Senegal. A creation of African social science research institutes, one of its main objectives is the development and coordination of social science research in Africa in order to enable African social scientists to come up with theoretical contributions and research results relevant to Africa's development. Economic cooperation among African countries remains one of the major items on the agenda for the development of Africa and the sovereignty of its people. Consequently, problems of regional cooperation and regional integration have always been one of the top areas of CODESRIA's research activities. This book, *ECONOMIC COOPERATION AND INTEGRATION IN AFRICA*, is a product of some of CODESRIA's activities in this field. It consists of papers presented at a conference convened by CODESRIA in Kinshasa, Zaire.

The book starts with a discussion of general problems of economic cooperation and integration. This is then followed by an examination by several contributors of the impact of external forces on regional economic integration. The third part takes up some concrete examples of attempts at regional economic cooperation. In the final section, the editor takes a critical look at the future of economic cooperation in Africa.

The editor, W. A. Ndongko, is Director of the Institute of Human Sciences, MESRES, Yaounde, Cameroon. He is also Professor of Economics at the University of Yaounde.
