When Emperor Haile Selassie led Ethiopia out of Italian occupation, he promised much — liberalisation, land reform, greater prosperity, a modern army, and a modern bureaucracy. Thirty years later, resistance, radical movements and dissent were to rock the foundations of his fragile new society into revolution.

The absence of details, up to date analysis, makes it difficult for modern students to understand the nature of the immense transformations the country went through during its imperial age. This work is an answer to that lack. Six

chapters investigate agriculture, industrialisation, monetary policy and demography. Topics range from drought, the radical land protests of the 1960s, industrialisation and manufacturing, to migration and the struggle for a currency.

An Economic History of Modern Ethiopia is a unique book written only by Ethiopians. Along with Volume II, covering the 'people's government' period of 1974, these books will be invaluable to any student of Ethiopia, or modern Africa.

SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION The Swaziland Case

In its experience of colonialism, Swaziland is not alone. The broad trends identified in the transformation of pre-colonial African societies apply equally to this country, surrounded on three sides by South Africa. In the development from the colonial to the capitalist mode of production new social forces have been unleashed and old ones transformed. The Swazi population has been dramatically affected by alienation, exploitation and appropriation.

In outlining this experience, this book provides a vital analytical link in the social and economic history of Swaziland. Chapters cover labour

migration, the effects of colonial rule on the pre-capitalist aristocracy, the growth of settler and cash crop farmers, the industrialization of agriculture and the appropriation of peasant labour. Industries investigated include mining, cotton, forestry and sugar.

Written by African social scientists, this volume makes an essential contribution to the ongoing debate and analysis of the impact of colonialism on Africa, while providing a detailed record of the unique case of Swaziland.



The nineteenth century in Africa was a time of revolution and tumultuous change in virtually all spheres. Violent dry spells, the staggered abolition of the slave trade, mass migrations and an influx of new settlers characterised the century. Regional trade links grew stronger and stretched further. The century also saw the beginnings of the ruthless and bloody quest for foreign domination.

This book, which won the Noma Award for Publishing in Africa in 1994, received the following jury citation: 'the book is an exercise in historical reconstruction, and its strength and distinction lies above all in its bold and

convincing challenge to hitherto accepted orthodoxies, terminologies, and interpretations, about the nature and development of African societies and economies. The book is an outstanding, pioneering work, destined to become highly influential, and providing such a wealth of information and detail as to elevate the study of African economic history to a new pedestal'. The jury considered a further achievement of the book to be its 'successful, continent-wide approach' and 'its thorough accessibility'. The very full documentary apparatus in the book, 'which also makes it an extremely useful work of reference', was similarly praised by the jury. The publisher, CODESRIA, was commended for 'having shown great enterprise in identifying and supporting the author and finding him the necessary resources'.
